Dear Parents and Carers,

Student Equipment Requirements

I hope this message finds you well. We want to ensure that students are fully prepared for learning each day and I thought it may be helpful for the school to remind families of what equipment students should bring to school.

Please take a moment to review the items your child is expected to bring to school daily. All items should be kept in a pencil case:

Basic Equipment:

- Pens (including a black or blue pen and a green pen). Either a fountain pens or biro's are acceptable.
- Pencils
- Ruler
- Scientific calculator
- Compass
- Protractor
- Whiteboard pen
- Glue stick

Lower school students have also been provided with the following for this school year:

- Knowledge Organiser- content for your child's learning for each year group can be found [here](#).
- Academic Planner- this should also contain their student access card and a copy of their timetable. Students are encouraged to take notes in their planner to support their communication with you.

Should a student lose either a knowledge organiser (years 10/11) or their planner (years 9/10/11), replacement items will need to be purchased via the LRC Shop on ParentPay and collected from the library.

Please note that the lanyard is no longer part of the school uniform but can be worn/purchased if your child wishes to do so. We have removed these from the uniform requirements in line with the government's agenda to reduce uniform costs for families.
