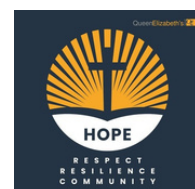

South West Schools Athletics Combined Events Championship

On the weekend of 27th June, 3 QE boys Will H, Harry R and Jamie H, represented Dorset, competing in the intermediate boys events. Will was 3rd (3778pts), Harry 4th (3769pts) and Jamie 7th (3069pts). They will now go through to the English Schools in September.

There were so many PB's. Some highlights include:

- Will H went over 5m for the first time in long jump with a jump of 5.66m
- Harry's shot putt, went out over 10m for the first time
- Harry ran an exceptional 400m time in 54.11.
- Jamie improved in the 100m hurdles dropping to 16.33s
- All 3 of them achieved PBs in the final event – the 1500m

The afternoon continued to highlight the incredible versatility of our musicians:

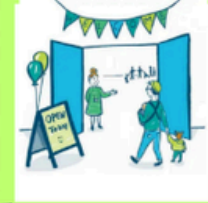
Kooth offers a wealth of information for students and parents to support mental health and wellbeing.
