

Ofsted Parents Evening

We welcomed parents to join us on Thursday 29th February to discuss the findings of Ofsted and set out our plans for the future.

Thank you to the 40 parents who attended this, we recognise that we need to create further opportunities for more parents to join us in school and for you to share your views. During the evening, we were able to respond to specific questions from you:

Here is a summary of the questions asked, grouped into our areas for improvement.

Area For Improvement 1:

- **Differentiation between Booklets and Knowledge Organisers:** You asked about the distinction between these resources. Booklets are now clarified as lesson materials, while knowledge organisers are lists aiding students in retaining key information.
- Learning Walks: You asked us to clarify the purpose of these. We explained the purpose and duration of learning walks to monitor teaching quality.
- New Timetable Impact: Concerns were raised about the timetable's effect on attendance and mental health. We introduced the new timetable to enhance student-teacher relationships, aiming to improve mental health and attendance, with ongoing monitoring.

Area For Improvement 2:

- Utilisation of Knowledge Organisers: In response to concerns regarding the effectiveness of knowledge organisers, we are reviewing the system of checking them.
- **Balancing Online Learning with SPARX:** Acknowledging concerns about online distractions, we emphasised the importance of balancing SPARX Maths with other forms of learning and assessment.
- **Engagement in Class Reading:** To improve engagement, we introduced Sparx Reader in Year 9, encouraging appropriate reading levels and exploring additional phonics support. We recognised that there is more to do here and also that reading physical books has an important role to play.

Area For Improvement 3:

- **OFSTED Revisit and inspection conduct:** Addressing worries about OFSTED revisit, we clarified the process for schools requiring improvement and expressed concerns about inspection conduct.
- **Trust Support:** Regarding the trust's role in improving results, we highlighted ongoing support measures and addressed concerns about promised provisions and ensuring personalised education for all students.
- **Warm Welcomes:** We clarified the purpose and duration of warm welcomes and checks on equipment and uniform to ensure a successful start to the school day and remove barriers to learning.
- **Staff Support:** We emphasised our commitment to staff wellbeing through leadership, support and access to our employee assistance programme.

Rapid Improvement Group

A Rapid Improvement Group is established when a priority school requires intervention to ensure rapid progress. This is in addition to the local school committee which continues to monitor school performance. The role of the group, through a fixed agenda is to challenge the school's impact against the following areas:

- 1. The Ofsted areas for improvement
- 2. The school improvement plan
- 3. Any external and internal reviews

The group is made up of trust leaders, local school committee members and school colleagues. There have been two meetings so far on 2nd February and 15th March.

The group has commissioned external reviews into:

- Attendance
- Provision for students with SEND
- Quality of education

The group reviews the impact of the school, through internal trust reviews, which include:

- Director of education report
- Safeguarding review
- Inclusion review

Y<mark>ea</mark>r 11 Intermediate Maths Challenge

Las<mark>t m</mark>onth, 74 of our Year 11 students took part in the UKMT Intermediate Maths Challenge, tes<mark>ting</mark> their mathematical problem solving and reasoning skills.

Schools only enter their best mathematicians into such a competition and less than half of entries come away with a certificate. With this in mind, I'm very proud to say that 52 of our QE students who took part scored high enough to achieve an award! 32 students took home bronze, 17 silver, and 3 students gold (which only 5% of entries manage to achieve), what a fantastic celebration for QE mathematicians!

A huge congratulations to all of those who took part, however I would particularly like to mention our top 3 performing students: Alex Elston (81 points), Lydia Norrish (78 points) and Hannah Churchill (77 points).

Well done to all students taking part, can our current Year 10 students out perform this fantastic set of results next year!


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Dance Live!
